What is the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)?

- The EYFS is the stage between birth to 5 years of age.
- The final year of the EYFS is the Reception year.
- Children move into Year 1 which is the start of the National Curriculum. This then follows them through their school career!

Early Years Curriculum

Activities in Reception are carefully planned and organised in order to provide a range of learning experiences. Individual records called learning journals are kept by staff to record the activities your child participates in and undertakes, as well as their progress in specific skills.

Planning for each week is carried out using a topic-based approach, following the children's interests and responding to specific events.

There are 7 Areas of Learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS), which activities are planned around:

- **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**
- **Physical Development**
- **Communication and Language**
- **Literacy**
- **Mathematics**
- **Understanding the World**
- **Expressive Arts and Design**



Learning Journey


Throughout the year, staff will record your child's learning in a variety of ways including Literacy Books, Maths Books, Phonics Books and observations. Together these will form a unique record of your child's learning and development. These all enable staff to track your child's progress and attainment, and also plan future activities.



Home Learning

We understand and value the support you provide for your child at home. Early years staff would love to hear about what you and your child have been doing at home. We encourage you to share your child's learning, achievements and experiences with staff, as this helps us to build a more complete picture of your child.

Your child will be provided with a reading book and record book which we encourage you to sign each time you read with your child.


We also have lots of opportunities for parents to come into school and be involved in their child's learning. Some examples from recent years include:

Class Mascot

Each class has its own class animal toy. If children display good behaviour choices and effort in their learning, the class mascot may choose to go to their house for the weekend! The children then record, with their parents help, their weekend adventures and share these with the rest of the class. Don't worry if they choose you on a weekend when you don't have anything exciting planned, even a trip to Morrison's with Boris in the trolley will excite their classmates!



Food and Drink

Lunch: At lunchtime your child can have a packed lunch prepared at home and brought into school, or a school dinner. Lunchtime is between 12.15 and 1.15, when the children can eat lunch and then play with their friends. All early years and Key Stage 1 children are entitled to a **free school meal** each day. There will be a selection of different meals available each day for your child to choose from. Vegetarian options are always available.



Food and Drink

Snacks: Children will receive a free piece of fruit every day, we encourage healthy eating. Your child is able to choose when they would like to eat their snack throughout the day in the snack café. Your children will be automatically enrolled on the free milk programme which is available to children of 4 years old. Once your child turns 5 the government no longer provides free milk, however you can pay for it yourself if you wish your child to carry on receiving it.



School Uniform

School uniform: The school uniform at Gunthorpe can be purchased from Chroma Sports or a supermarket alternative in the following colours:

Girls: white /blue polo shirt, navy blue jumper /cardigan, grey skirt /trousers /dress, blue summer dress, white socks /grey tights, black shoes

Boys: white /blue polo shirt, navy blue jumper, grey shorts /trousers, grey socks, black shoes

PE Kits: All children are required to have a PE kit which they will wear on their PE day. The Gunthorpe PE kit can be purchased from Chroma Sports or a plain white top and blue shorts can be worn. Children also need a pair of trainers or plimsoles.




How we transition... Home and School Visits

Stay and Plays: Your child will have the opportunity to visit their classroom. This is a chance for them to meet their teacher and teaching assistant, look around the classroom and outside area in order to help familiarise themselves with their new environment.



Home Visits: These are an opportunity for school staff to meet you and your child in a relaxed and familiar environment. It is an important opportunity to share information about your child and about the school. The Reception staff will conduct the visit and we would like to speak to you and your child during the visit.
